

APPENDIX F**DRESS REGULATIONS FOR VETERANS AT MEMORIAL SERVICES**

1. Each veterans' organisation should have its own dress regulations.
2. Invitations to memorial services should stipulate the dress code.
3. In the absence of any modifications flowing from 1 and 2 above, the dress to be worn by military veterans at memorial services is as follows:
 - a. Association jacket and tie (or business suit for males).
 - b. Association headdress (where applicable).
 - c. Medals on the left chest.
 - d. Non-military medals and those of parents may be worn on the right chest.
 - e. Own association penants/metal badges, including approved qualification badges, on the left lapel.
 - f. Penants/metal badges of the CMVO and other veterans' organisations on the right lapel.
 - g. Poppy's should be worn on the right lapel in November each year.

Note:

1. On appropriate occasions, veterans may wear the green SANMVA uniform and headdress.
2. Black arm bands should be worn at funerals.
